I remember my first reaction of sheer shock when I visited a squatter area in Manila and saw hundreds of children living and working in other people's rubbish. This was the moment when I knew I had a choice to make, to walk away or to help the children, a choice that humbled, enriched and completely changed my life.

With your incredible support and belief in the work of PCF, we have been able to help thousands of families with our holistic programmes. In 2010 we moved our base of operations away from being in the heart of the community to our new school building allowing us to focus on education, and in 2015, we were very happy to hand over the management of the school to the Philippine board of trustees and CEO.

I have recently returned from a visit to the Philippines where I was devastated to see how much the area where our

base of operations used to be has deteriorated. It has become even more overcrowded since the dump site was closed. Distraught families gathered together and asked me if we could work with them to help them leave the slum.

New Community Livelihood Programmes

Parents can learn and perfect new skills through a variety of programmes and PCF supports their children in school. We provide mothers with a sustainable income by training them how to make beautiful upcycled products; during their training they receive weekly food parcels for their families. When the artisans are qualified they will have the opportunity to start their own business or to continue earning a good income making our products.



Jocelyn started as a livelihood trainee and has lived in the community since she was 2 years old, she now runs our new livelihood programme.

FATHERS BACK TO WORK PROGRAMME

Providing livelihood opportunities for women has made some husbands feel inferior or inadequate because they cannot contribute as much income for their families as their wives. So many men in the slum areas have not benefited from an education, finding themselves trapped in unreliable casual labour. We have two new programmes for fathers.

Fathers can prepare recyclables in our new livelihood programme, or access free training with our Back to Work Programme in the construction industry. Fathers are grouped together to support one another during their training and the programme will fund training fees, meals and support to secure Government documents to enable them to start work.

Community Feeding Programme



Families often have to survive with just one or two small meals a day consisting mainly of rice and gravy. The elderly, disabled, toddlers, children not in school, pregnant and nursing mothers are the most vulnerable in the community.

We have partnered with Kalayaan Community Ministries (KCM) run by Ron and Joanna Domingo and want to renovate and equip the kitchen and expand the community feeding programme. Parent volunteers will help run the feeding programme providing hot nutritious meals from the kitchen.

Community Health Programme

Training session with CHW ladies.

There is a desperate need for a community walk in clinic, families cannot afford basic health care. They often in desperation ask their neighbours if they have any medicine they can use even if it is for a different illness. Together with KCM we are renovating and equipping a room in the old school to use as a community walk in clinic.

We are training 50 mothers as Community Health Workers (CHW) in primary health and preventative care with KCM'S nurse. Many of the illnesses could easily be cured if caught early enough and treated by family members if only they knew what action they should take. When the mothers are fully trained they will be issued with first aid kits. We will work closely with the CHW's and assist any families who need further help.

Special thanks to Sutton Coldfield Soroptimists who have funded the renovation, equipping and CHW training. This year there has been an increased number of students who have dropped out of school for a variety of reasons. Some children don't have strong parental support and often find it too difficult to stay in school and need a more hands on approach.

We have designed a new mentoring programme for school drop outs. Students will be in groups of 15 and will receive regular one to one mentoring from their community education volunteers who will provide support and advice and everything they need to stay in school.

We need sponsors for our new mentoring programme to help provide school uniforms, books, shoes and transportation for the groups, the new community feeding programme will provide them with a daily packed lunch.

Sponsorship is £20 a month and you will receive two reports a year on the progress of your group with photographs and messages from the children, their education grades and an overview update from the community volunteers.

Together we can ensure that all children have the opportunity to complete their education and get one step closer to achieving their dreams. UK and Tanzania Programmes

The main focus of the work of the PCF is providing opportunities for the families living in urban slums in the Philippines and we also run small

programmes in the UK and Tanzania.

UK

Many people mistakenly believe that asylum seekers want to come to the UK. The reality is most would prefer to be in their homes, in their own country with the people they love, pursuing their dreams and the futures that they had planned for.

PCF is bridging a gap for the asylum seekers and refugees in Hampshire by providing a forum where women can meet together, be treated with dignity and respect and take part in practical activities such as sewing and handicrafts to help them learn new skills and give them a sense of achievement and self worth.



"We come from many different countries and we look forward to our weekly group meeting. We have become friends and love learning new sewing skills. We are all keen to contribute to UK society and one of the many things we are learning is how to make ground sheets for the homeless from plastic bags, it is so cold in the UK!"

Jane and our wonderful textiles trainer Diane were asked to visit the Rotary Club District Guildford's sewing projects in Tanzania to help their groups of women earn a sustainable income.

Jane and Diane were able to design new products for a group of albino women to help them sell to the tourist trade and also develop new sewing skills for a group of vulnerable young girls so that they can sell school uniforms to their local school.

In 2018 we are planning to send our Filipino livelihood trainers to Tanzania to teach the artisans how to make ring pull products. Our Filipino trainers will also visit the local dumpsite to teach the waste pickers how to make our beautiful ring pull products.

Aid Relief

In August a fire broke out in the community leaving 756 families homeless, all their belongings were lost. Leave PCF a Gift in your Will

Making a Will is the best way to ensure that your future wishes are addressed and carried out. By remembering PCF in your Will, you can be sure your legacy will be used to give hope to the future of poor, orphan, vulnerable and under privileged children in the Philippines.

There are two possible ways of leaving a legacy to PCF in you Will. A Pecuniary Gift - this is a specified amount of money. A Residuary Gift - this is a share of an estate once any pecuniary gifts, expenses or debts have been paid.

If you would like to add a PCF legacy to an existing Will you will need to fill in a Codicil document outlining the amendments. These can be obtained from a solicitor and once filled in, will need to be signed by two independent witnesses. Thank you.
