I would like to start this newsletter by saying thank you for all your support, kindness, and generosity. I can't deny, 2023 has been the toughest year in our history, for several months our income did not match our monthly expenditure and those were nail biting months for us! After 21 years of working with some of the most resilient people I know, the community's resilience rubbed off on us and we have not given up hope that we will continue to get through these challenging months. We could not have done this without you! We sent out several heartfelt appeals and so many responded positively, and those who could not donate, sent myself and our team so many encouraging messages, we can't thank you enough!

Despite the need to make some cutbacks to our services, we started our new bakery making our popular banana bread and freshly baked breads for our feeding programmes and giving employment to 11 mothers to sell our baked goods in the community. This is generating £35.00 income a week for them, which is enough for them to buy food for their family for a week.

Thanks to several Rotary Clubs in D1110 and a UK grant we taught ourselves how to grow our own chicken feed by building Azolla ponds so the chicken farm could become sustainable. This is now generating £720 sales of eggs as well as providing 600 eggs a week for our kitchen and bakery.






EDUCATION











As ever the students never disappoint us and out of 369 students 79 received high honours, honours, deans lister and cum laude. They try so hard to be the best students they can be and this year 40 young people, most of whom joined PCF when they were 5 years old, graduate from university with degrees in Business Studies making it possible for them to secure employment in Finance, Teaching, Nursing, Human Resources, plus one Pharmacist, two Marine Biologists, and one Fashion Designer.

This year a record 145 students have enrolled into university; we are incredibly proud of them, their own determination to succeed and reach their goals despite all the challenges they face is an inspiration to us to do all that we can to make sure they have the resources they need to graduate.

HEALTH ELIME

Our Health Clinic serves approximately 12,000 – 13,500 patients a year. Most families are struggling to meet their basic needs, making health care too expensive, our clinic serves the poorest of the poor from the community. The clinic has seen girls with infections because they cannot afford to regularly change their sanitary pads.



Due to the support from the Sutton Coldfield Soroptimists and donations in kind from local supporters we have provided a monthly supply of sanitary pads to 144 of our students who cannot afford sanitary wear.

Plans are now underway to make reusable sanitary pads for the wider community.

A local donation was made to provide 27 toilets for families in the community. Many families do not have space in their shanties for a toilet so the addition of the toilets will also mean that the families will share their toilet facility with their neighbours.











Thank you so much for all your support over the years - you have enabled us to make remarkable achievements in 21 years. Help us continue to provide poverty reduction programmes for all our school children ensuring that they go on to university and can pursue the careers of their choice.
