Last year has tested us deeply with three devastating fires and one powerful typhoon disrupting lives, destroying homes, and challenging our resolve. Yet, in every hardship we found hope, and in every setback we saw the power of working together.

We celebrated 26 graduates from our education program 99% of our student body passed their exams, opening the door to brighter futures. Our health clinic welcomed a new doctor, extended clinic days and expanded access to medicines for those living with chronic illness. Our social workers surveys identified more vulnerable seniors and new child workers, ensuring they are now at the heart of our care and protection efforts.

And despite the challenges this year with the July typhoons and the August fire, our teams were on the ground every day delivering urgent relief and helping families rebuild their lives. This year we also repaired their shanties after the floods, continued providing maintenance medicines, and distributed rain gear, rubber boots, and new bedding to keep them safe and comfortable. At lunchtime, our main hall has become a lively community centre where seniors join chair, Pilates sessions, play bingo, and enjoy prizes that are both fun and practical. They are not just beneficiaries they are part of our family, and we are honoured to walk alongside them in this chapter of their lives and with the donors who have faithfully supported this program.
